PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Last month CAPP renewed an agreement with the Petroleum Registry that extends free access to the training modules to all students registered in the CAPP program. This agreement has allowed CAPP to ensure that all students going through our education program complete the training modules associated with the various levels of our courses. It has also allowed our students to have current training with no additional financial burden. This provides employers with the knowledge that the students have up-to-date information with regard to the Registry. On behalf of the CAPP Board, I would like to thank the Registry partners, Alberta Department of Energy, CAPP and SEPAC for their foresight in continuing with this agreement that was originally signed when the Registry was first brought online in the fall of 2002.

On behalf of CAPP, on March the 7th I attended the first day of the North American Natural Gas Conference held in Calgary. The topics dealt with Traditional Domestic supplies, Exogenous Future Supplies, North American Demand, Natural Gas End Users and Natural Gas Prices. A question put to the Alberta Energy Minister, the Honourable Greg Melchin, by Mr. Ken Malloy regarding the possibility of a return to the days of either Regulation or more regulation and management, was responded to by the Minister. He replied that it was not in Alberta's interest to do so. Alberta believes that the extraction of resources can co-exist with the protection of the environment and species. And by trying to ensure efficiency of standards, set them and stand by them so that applications don't take years to finalize.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE cont'd

Also discussed during the first day of the conference were issues regarding declining production in traditional domestic supplies. It was felt that some of these rumours of "terminal decline" could be addressed through positive policy actions and investment in new technology. (Mr. Kello Kuuskraa). Overall, the panelists in this discussion seemed to be of the opinion that in order to maintain the production output, there would be a requirement of two times or slightly less the investment but with greater efficiencies as seen in Western Canada that need to double or triple investment has occurred. The industry is not short of cash but short of opportunities.

I expect to have a more detailed account of the panel discussions held at this conference available for publication in a future edition of the ReCap.

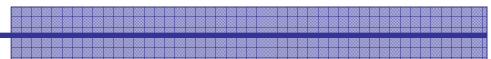
